The Eden Killer Whale Museum, established in 1931, is one of the oldest museums in NSW and records for posterity the incredible battle between intrepid men in rowboats armed only with hand harpoons and the leviathans of the sea. It is a public museum administered by the Eden Killer Whale Museum and Historical Society (a voluntary committee of Bega Valley Shire Council) and its only regular income is generated from door takings, sales of souvenirs and donations.

The committee has, as its number one objective, the goal of implementing best museum practices, while providing entertaining and educational presentations to its visitors together with making them as comfortable as possible.

Over the past few years, a programme of touring exhibitions has been pursued with success and this, together with regular and changing existing exhibitions, combine to present a differing perspective, for the regular visitor

The committee is conscious of the needs of children and as such, exhibitions and hands on displays appealing to our younger visitor are included in the agenda where possible.

The Eden Killer Whale Museum is a progressive institution, becoming increasingly recognised as such throughout the museum and gallery community of Australia.
